<u>CONTRACT</u> about School Uniforms for Chhimbu Primary School between Beni Women Group and Skivehus Rotary Klub <u>31. October 2001</u>

1): Like last year the School Committee of Chhimbu Primary School collects the money from parents and other villagers, and from this money the **fabric** shall be bought, and delivered for Beni Women Group. It is the hope that the School Committee will collect enough of money to give **all** children at the school a uniform. The supplement of the money can be found also from donations from other villagers and from tourists, so also poor children can have a uniform.

2): The **sewing charge** of Beni Women Group shall be paid by Chhimbu Primary School. But only for Beni Women Group. If other tailor is employed, he shall be paid by School Committee and not by the school.

3): In the month of Marts the School Committee shall collect the money.

4): In the first part of the month of April two members of Beni Women Group will arrive in Chhumbu to take meassures and to discuss style and other conditions. They shall give message to Chhumbu two weeks in advance of their arrival.

5): A): Beni Women Group will collect the money and buy the fabric - or

B): School Committee will buy the fabric and deliver it for Beni Women Group

6): Beni Women Group will ask a tailor experienced in sewing tetung (f.i. Damai Kancha from Nile) to show how the fabric should be cut and how to sew it. The women group can decide in cooperation with School Committee how far they want to sew unique sizes every student or sewing in four different sizes only.

7): After being taught by an experienced tailor, the women group shall themselves hereafter sew the uniforms.

8): The uniforms should be delivered in Chhumbu before one month after the fabric is delivered in Junbesi. But then the fabric has to be delivered before 15. April.

9): Sewing charge each uniform is 200 Rs (two hundred). This charge includes measure visit in Chhimbu (4.) and delivering of the uniforms when finished.

10): If there is surplus of fabric left after sewing all the uniforms, then the fabric should be returned to the school with the uniforms.

11): Sewing charge is to be paid for Beni Women Group by Schoolmaster Jangbu Sherpa after the delivery of the uniforms and next time he is going for bank.

School Uniforms for Chhumbu Primary School

September 2000

On the way of Skivehus Rotary Klub it is on 23. September 2000 decided that Rotary will help in sewing school uniforms for Chhumbu Primary School on the following conditions:

The Managing Committee of Chhumbu Primary School will provide the clothes for the children of the school.

The Managing Committee will collect the money from the villagers of Chhumbu, to buy all the fabric (clothes) and all the materials for the uniforms.

The Managing Committee decides the quality of the fabric (clothes) according to the season and to their wish of payment.

The uniform has to be in tetung style in a blue colour with black trousers or skirt. In short or long length according to the wish of the villagers.

The Managing Committee should two times every year take measures of the children, collect the money, buy the fabrics and deliver the measurements and fabrics at Junbesi Silaybunai Kendra Women Committee.

Junbesi Silaybunai Kendra Women Committee shall do the sewing of the uniforms for Chhumbu Primary School.

For this work they will receive from Rotary the amount of 150 Rs each set of uniforms, which for the year 2000/2001 will be approximately 6.000 Rs.

This amount can be discussed during time with Rotary.

For this amount the Women Committee can do what they want. They can buy help from experienced tailors to learn - or they can buy sewing machines - or they can use the money for other purposes - or they can divide the amount as a salary.

When finished the uniforms, the Women Committee will deliver it at Chhumbu.

The salary of the Women Committee will be delivered after finishing each set of uniforms by informing Skivehus Rotary Klub, Denmark through Kazi Sherpa, Kathmandu. Or we will find a way through Chhumbu School Account by Jangbu Sherpa, Chhumbu.

Contract

concerning School Uniforms

for Chhumbu Primary School

May 2000

The amount of 2.500 Danish Crowns, is received by <u>Ang Phuti Lama</u> on behalf of <u>Junbesi Silaybunai</u> <u>Kendra</u> from Skivehus Rotary Klub on the date of 10. of May 2000.

The amount shall cover the expenses for materials and for labour in producing the school uniforms for Chhumbu Primary School.

The labour cost of each uniform is agreed to be approximately calculated 350 Rs each set

Fabric:

There shall be bought a fabric in a good quality, buttons, tread and other essentials for producing approximately 45 tetung's and trousers/skirts.

The tetung shall be in a bright blue colour.

The trousers/skirts shall be in black colour.

In Chhumbu shall be taken measures of all the children, who is supposed to attend the specified school, when they are started.

Children who is too young or to old to join the schools, or children who is attending other schools shall have NO uniform.

There will probably be some materials in surplus after producing all the uniforms. These materials belong to Skivehus Rotary Klub, and shall be left for next years producing of uniforms.

The buying of materials and the taking of measures can be done at once, but the very producing of the uniforms for each child must wait until further notice is given

Account:

After the work has finished an account must be done.

This account must contain all receipts from buying of materials.

And specified labour cost for each specimen.

A surplus of money from the original amount, belongs to Skivehus Rotary Klub, and will be left over for the next producing of uniforms next year.

A lack of money will be transferred through Himalayan Project, Nepal (HIPRON) in Kathmandu or by Himalayan Project, Denmark during our visit in Junbesi-Mopung in mid September 2000.
