History: In 1996 more than 100 ropani of land were bought for Junbesi School at Cheding. In 1997 the "Kitchenhouse" were build serving as kitchen for those living in "Sherpahouse", which were build soon after. In 1998 the "Dormitory" were build, as well



as 1 Kw hydroelectricity plant. Later the "Playground" and surrounding wall were build. Then "Kitchenhouse" were subdivided into more rooms for 2 students, with one small kitchen for each room.

Problem: In 2003 the roof of "Kitchenhouse" were in bad repair with several places with water entering the loft. The roof were build with wood shingles in contrast to the other houses which were roofed with corrugated iron of longer durability. The roof needs repair urgently and there is a wish that it should be roofed with corrugated iron as the other buildings. But the school doesn't have the budget for this re-roofing and particularly not for the more expensive iron plates. And the repair is needed before rainy season 2004.



Funding: The School Managing Committee applied Himalayan Project for support for re-roofing the "Kitchenhouse". Himalayan Project applied among the members to find the fundings and 3.000 Dkr (approx. 30.000 Rs) were donated by Werner & Margrethe Pedersen. Himalayan Project decided thereafter to double up. This results in a support from Himalayan Project on 6.000 Dkr (or 60-70.000 Rs).

Budget: In the application of the school no budget were mentioned. But it is mentioned that 14 bundles á 8 pieces of 6" corrugated iron is needed. In Kathmandu it is sold at 12 pieces per bundle, which is 10 bundles. In the heavy quality of 24 gauge the price for colored irons is 6.700 Rs per bundle and with no color 3.700 Rs per bundle. For the same at 26 gauge it is approx. 20% cheaper and again 20% cheaper for 28 gauge.

Russ Moir, the Canadian teacher helping in the education at the school, suggests that the students learn some skills from experiences craftsmen. Himalayan Project will too recommend doing this with the double purpose of education, and saving a part of the salary

for craftsmen.

alternative solutions.

The price on corrugated iron should be compared between Saleri and Kathmandu including

transportation.

Other sources of funds should be checked.

HCDO shall in cooperation with Junbesi Secondary School prepare a full report on the project forwarding it for HP, before HP can transfer the amount.

HCDO can take a percentage of the support from HP to do this work, which shall be negotiated with HP and the School Committee. The more work HCDO has to do with the report, the higher the subsidy, and the more the School Committee can do themselves, the less subsidy. But a incomplete report will anyway lead to new questions and delay of support, and more expenses and time-consumption in the reporting.

Another Preliminary investigation: When HCDO is there they should discuss with the teachers and School Committee about the possible future project of moving the secondary school for Cheding Hostel Area. And building up a Technical School. A preliminary report would be appreciated very much from Himalayan Project's side.

Summary: In November of 2003, Chairman, of Himalayan Project of Denmark, Mr. roofing its hostel kitchen-house. Himalayan Project then asked Himalayan Community Development Organization (HCDO) to Kurt Lomborg received a request from the Junbesi High School to support with re- asses and send proposal for re-roofing work of the Junbesi School hostel kitchenhouse. Project committee of HCDO consulted the Junbesi School Board committee and asses the condition then prepared this proposal.

History: The Junbesi School Board committee built the kitchen-house in the premises of school's over 70 acres of land. Other buildings and playground with surrounding wall were built in 1998. There are immediately nearly 300 students attending this school. Junbesi village is one of the oldest sherpa settlement situated in a high Mountain valley. Most of the people of this village rely on subsistence farming and supplemented by income from tourism to support their family and community.

Problem: As the kitchen roofing was done with wood shingles the condition of the roof started deteriorating early 2003 and the board committee is concerned and wish that the re-roofing work be done urgently. As the other buildings, roofs were done with CGI (zinc) sheets that tend to last for more than 30 years and committee wish the kitchen house roof with same material before this monsoon season. This school does not have the funds and desperately seeking support of Himalayan Project (Denmark).

Budget: In the application of the school to HP did not mentioned budget needed for re-roofing work. The project committee of HCDO gathered all the detailed cost for completing the work based on the list of material provided by the school and details as follow;

1. 15 bundles color 26 gauge CGI sheets (Rs. 6500 x 15)
2. Plain sheet 725
3. Sky light sheets (Rs. 1300 x 4pcs)
4. Neil 3 inches (Rs. 60 x 16kg)
5. Wire (Rs. 60 x 5 kg)
6. Handle and Cargo charges Rs. 26 x 1150kgs
7. Technician and carpenter Wages
8. Wood and Stone
9. Window iron net (Rs. 1775 x 1 bundle)

Note:

- 1. Total cost Rs. 158,935 is equivalent to USD 2208
- 2. Alternately plain 26 gauge CGI Sheet cost Rs. 4,800/bundle or Rs. 72,000 for 15 b.
- 3. Total cost getting those materials from Salleri (local) market exceed the total cost getting them from Kathmandu.

On 2. November 2004 a meeting were held in Junbesi School between Junbesi School Managing Committee chaired by Mr. Dendi Sherpa, Teachers of Junbesi School chaired by Mr. Chhongba Lama, and the two members of Himalayan Project, Denmark Mr. Thoeger Berg Nielsen and Kurt Lomborg.

The roof of Cheding Ground Kitchenhouse were examined and the wooden shingles were found in even worse coedition than previously. The beam construction of the roof were found healthy and in good condition, but to prevent damages it were decided to do repair of the roof before next rainy season in summer 2005.

Himalayan Project told that the budget from their side is 6.000 Danish Kroner (approximately 72.000 NRS).

School Managing Committee agreed to pay 20.000 NRS from the School's Fund.

Thereafter Himalayan Project agreed to pay the rest of needed roof tinnsheets and the transportation with truck from Kathmandu to Jiri (or Shivalaya).

School Managing Committee agreed in arranging and paying the rest transportation from Jiri (or Shivalaya) to Junbesi School Kitchenhouse, as well as putting up the tinnsheets on the roof.

On 5. November 2004 Mr. Dendi Sherpa handed over 20.000 NRS for Mr. Kurt Lomborg.
